## INTERNSHIP AT ENDICOTT








Endicott Locations in New England




#### UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT BY ACADEMIC SCHOOL




## STATES REPRESENTED BY TRADITIONAL UNDERGRADUATES


#### GRADUATE STUDENT ENROLLMENT – IN THE UNITED STATES




