



Graduate & Professional Studies Financial Aid Instructions

To qualify for financial aid, you must be a U.S. citizen or an eligible non-citizen, accepted into a program, and enrolled at least half-time; you cannot be in default of any previous federal student loans, and you must maintain good academic standing.

In order for us to be able to determine your financial aid eligibility, you must first complete the steps below.

1. Complete and submit the Van Loan School Financial Aid Application available at vanloan.endicott.edu/financialaid.
2. Complete the 2021–22 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) available at fafsa.gov.

Note: Endicott College's school code is 002148. Endicott will receive your FAFSA information electronically within 3–5 business days.

3. Submit a copy of your schedule to the financial aid advisor for your program.
