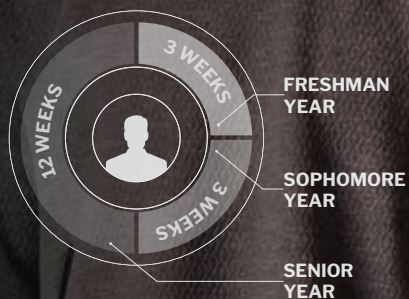

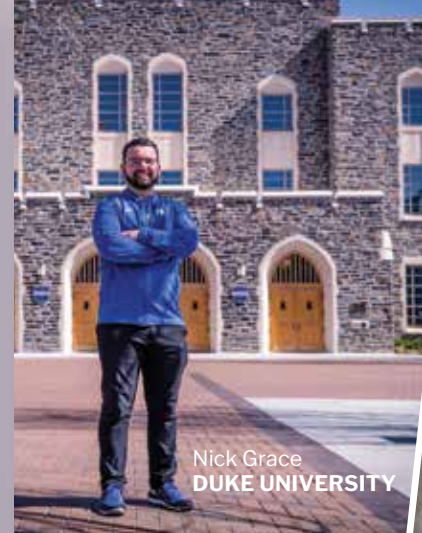

A linguist at heart, Jamyang Tamang ’22, known simply as “Z,” speaks three languages and has learned to program in five. He relishes the feeling of not understanding a puzzle and then learning to break a language down into decipherable codes. It took coming to Endicott to get to know his passion for computers and software engineering.

Growing up as the son of two government officials in Sikkim, India, Z imagined a simpler future for himself at a local technical college. But he attended an international high school and the principal happened to be from Beverly, Mass., and good friends with Charlotte Gordon, Distinguished Professor of English at Endicott.

“She was our connection,” says Z. When he spoke with Gordon and learned that other students from his high school were succeeding at Endicott, he eagerly applied.

To other incoming students, especially international students, “you have got to make that first move,” he says. “Just go up and talk to people and then keep at it.” Eventually, he got to know other international students and made lasting friendships through the Computer Science Club.

And the College’s liberal arts curriculum deeply expanded his world views. Two of Gordon’s courses raised his consciousness about identity and racism in America. “They really helped me grow,” he says.

But Z says the best time of all was spent living at Endicott and interning at Thrive Bioscience last summer. He recommends living on-campus for one summer to everyone. “Everybody is in a happy mood and it’s just a really positive place,” he says.

Nate Magoon, a digital media major, started performing in the theater when he was 10. Since then, it’s always served as a safe place, a community. It’s also something that attracted him to Endicott. Other schools, he explained, didn’t allow as much freedom to pursue extracurriculars. Magoon wanted to do it all, and Endicott allowed that flexibility.

Throughout his time at Endicott, he’s served as a community service leader, a resident assistant, and a campus tour guide. Showing the Beverly campus to prospective students has been one of his favorite things about his experience.

Internships have been another rewarding aspect of Magoon’s experience. He worked with TV station WMUR News 9 in New Hampshire—first as a digital media intern and then as a freelance production assistant. During senior year, he was a marketing and communications intern for the Wenham Museum and, this summer, he’ll travel with Firecracker Sports as one of its digital content interns.

Each internship has been satisfying in different ways, he explained, emphasizing that they put into focus what he does and does not want in a career: “When I’m on tours, one of the biggest things I share with families is you kind of have to think of internships as letting yourself try different ice cream flavors. There are so many kinds of things you can do, so you’re really giving yourself the opportunity to try it before you must commit to it long term. I think that’s a beautiful thing.”

“I’m now in my senior year and I’m a queer person who’s a student leader. My 17-year-old self would not believe it,” he said. “I’ve had plenty of residents—plenty!—over the past three years who have identified as queer or part of the LGBTQIA+ community. I’m thankful that I’ve been able to be a resource for them and hopefully be a symbol that a person who identifies as a member of that community can have success on Endicott’s campus.”

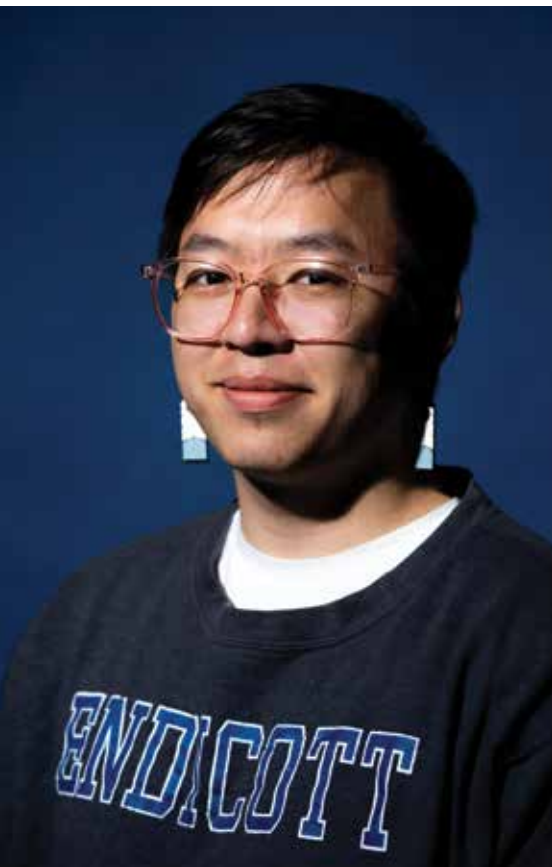

I am fortunate enough to have already been offered a post-graduate position at Olson Twombly as a design associate, and I believe Endicott’s internship program is largely responsible for that.

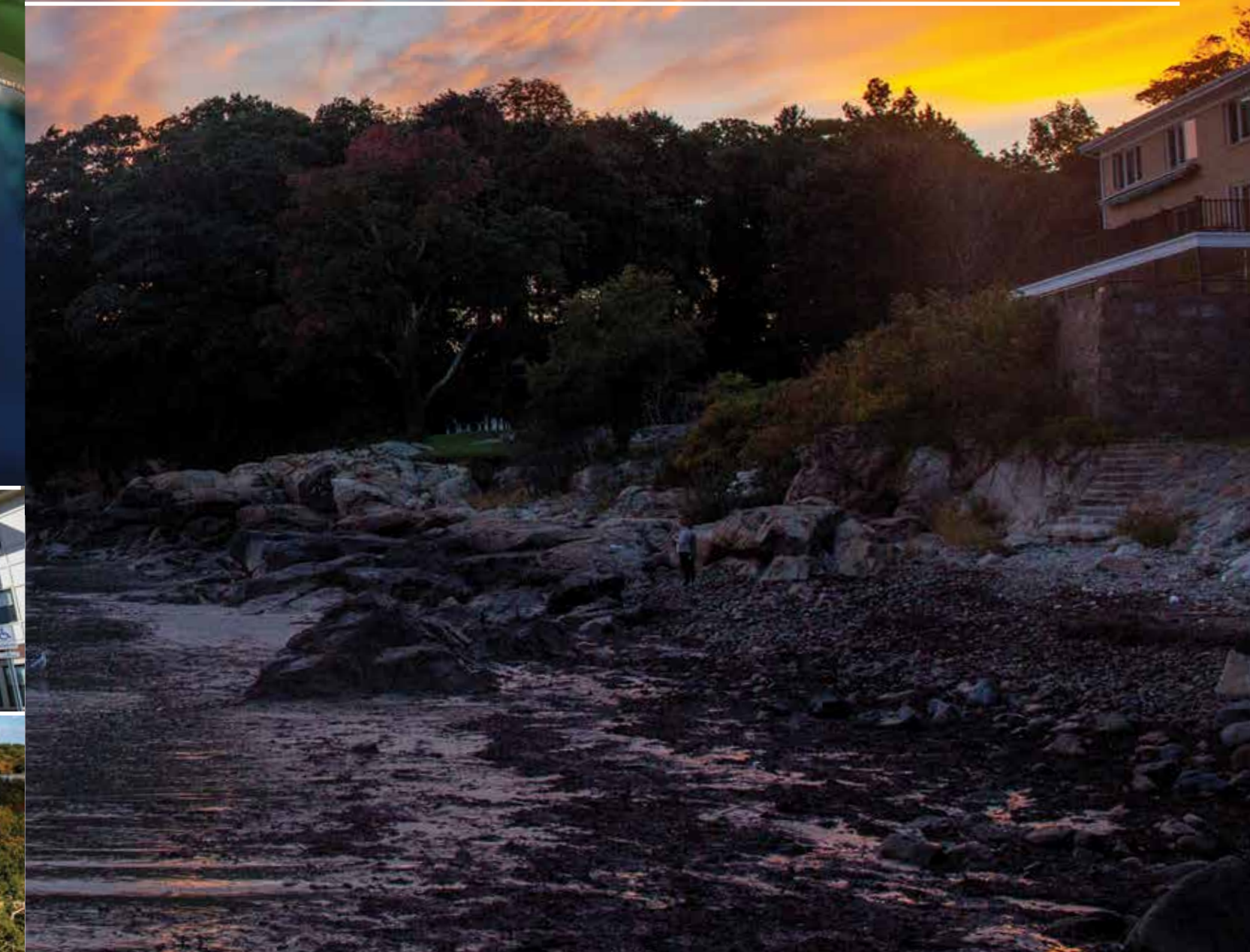
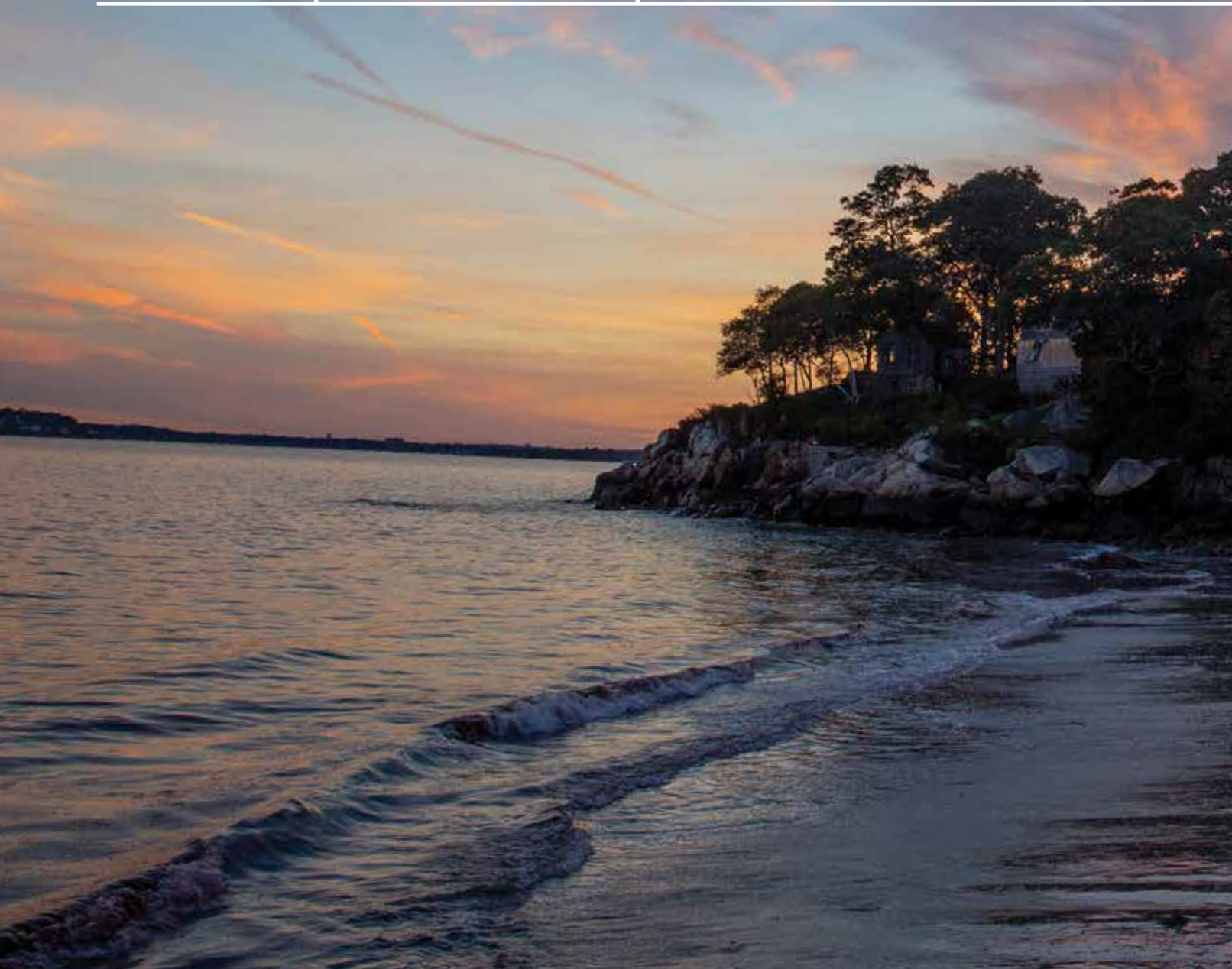

Elizabeth Matelski

Meet Your Professor

Dr. Elizabeth Matelski, Associate Professor of History at Endicott College, is the 2022 recipient of the Academic Excellence Award, which recognizes an exemplary member of the faculty for outstanding teaching, scholarship, and service to the College over the past year.

Since 2016, Elizabeth Matelski has been teaching a wide variety of history courses at Endicott College. From African American History to Women in American Culture, Matelski wants her students to realize that the lessons from the past can still be applied today. “My goal is never just to have my students be interesting at a party with trivia knowledge, but that they are able to apply what they have learned to make tangible and powerful connections to today,” Matelski said.

One of her most popular courses is on the Salem Witch Trials, which connects to the local history in Beverly and beyond, “but we go beyond what happened in 1692,” she added. “The course also extends to the second half of the semester to discuss examples of 20th century witch hunts and scapegoating, such as Japanese-American incarceration during World War II, the Red Scare, and the AIDS epidemic.”

It’s one thing to learn about history in the classroom, but Endicott also gives students the opportunity to explore it off campus. “I always enjoy taking field trips with students to places of historical significance in the area,” said Matelski. “I remember taking a group to the History Project in Boston, which documents LGBTQ history in the area. We spent the day volunteering in the archives to digitize resources and make them available to other researchers. This was one of my first years at Endicott and I’m still in touch with those students today. It was one of those college experiences that I think they’ll always remember when looking back at their time here.”

So why does Matelski think students ultimately choose Endicott? “The first thing people notice might be the beautiful campus, but I really think it’s our internship program that makes us unique,” she said. “By taking two internships before their semester-long internship during senior year, students are able to test out their career before making a full commitment.” Beyond the experiential learning, Matelski believes that all faculty help make Endicott a special place. “All of the faculty want to educate the whole person, not just a student in our classroom. You’re not just a number in a massive lecture hall here—there’s a strong person-to-person connection, which is why I’m glad I get to teach at a school like this.”

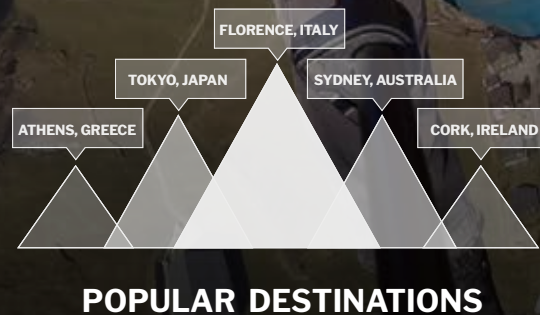
