

Major: Computer Science Internship: Thrive Bioscience

A linguist at heart, Jamyang Tamang '22, known simply as "Z," speaks three languages and has learned to program in five. He relishes the feeling of not understanding a puzzle and then learning to break a language down into decipherable codes. It took coming to Endicott to get to know his passion for computers and software engineering.

Growing up as the son of two government officials in Sikkim, India, Z imagined a simpler future for himself at a local technical college. But he attended an international high school and the principal happened to be from Beverly, Mass., and good friends with Charlotte Gordon, Distinguished Professor of English at Endicott.

"She was our connection," says Z. When he spoke with Gordon and learned that other students from his high school were succeeding at Endicott, he eagerly applied.

To other incoming students, especially international students, "you have got to make that first move," he says. "Just go up and talk to people and then keep at it." Eventually, he got to know other international students and made lasting friendships through the Computer Science Club.

And the College's liberal arts curriculum deeply expanded his world views. Two of Gordon's courses raised his consciousness about identity and racism in America. "They really helped me grow," he says.

But Z says the best time of all was spent living at Endicott and interning at Thrive Bioscience last summer. He recommends living oncampus for one summer to everyone.

"Everybody is in a happy mood and it's just a really positive place," he says.







Nate Magoon Salem, N.H. Class of 2022

Major: Digital Media Internship: Wenham Museum

Nate Magoon, a digital media major, started performing in the theater when he was 10. Since then, it's always served as a safe place, a community. It's also something that attracted him to Endicott. Other schools, he explained, didn't allow as much freedom to pursue extracurriculars. Magoon wanted to do it all, and Endicott allowed that flexibility.

Throughout his time at Endicott, he's served as a community service leader, a resident assistant, and a campus tour guide. Showing the Beverly campus to prospective students has been one of his favorite things about his experience.

Internships have been another rewarding aspect of Magoon's experience. He worked with TV station WMUR News 9 in New Hampshire—first as a digital media intern and then as a freelance production assistant. During senior year, he was a marketing and communications intern for the Wenham Museum and, this summer, he'll travel with Firecracker Sports as one of its digital content interns.

Each internship has been satisfying in different ways, he explained, emphasizing that they put into focus what he does and does not want in a career: "When I'm on tours, one of the biggest things I share with families is you kind of have to think of internships as letting yourself try different ice cream flavors. There are so many kinds of things you can do, so you're really giving yourself the opportunity to try it before you must commit to it long term. I think that's a beautiful thing."

"I'm now in my senior year and I'm a queer person who's a student leader. My 17-year-old self would not believe it," he said. "I've had plenty of residents—plenty!—over the past three years who have identified as queer or part of the LGBTQIA+ community. I'm thankful that I've been able to be a resource for them and hopefully be a symbol that a person who identifies as a member of that community can have success on Endicott's campus."

"I chose Endicott because when I first visited campus, something about it felt a little bit like home. 
Her favorite thing to do on the weekends is to go out to eat. "I am a huge foodie, and there are tons of really great restaurants just minutes away from campus."

I would not trade my past three years here for anything.










