Endicott College Credit Hour Policy Approved by President's Council – March 19, 2013

Institution Wide Definitions and Policies

- a. Endicott College uses the credit hour as the measure of academic currency
- b. Credit hour definition: in general, a credit hour is an amount of work represented in intended learning outcomes and verified by evidence of student achievement.
- c. Semester definition: A standard semester is approximately 15 weeks.
- d. Formulas
 - i. In lecture courses, one semester hour of credit equals one hour of class instruction and at least two hours of work outside class for 15 weeks.
 - ii. A 3-credit course consists of 45 contact hours and 90 hours of outside work. The DOE has indicated that a 50 minute class is equivalent to an hour of instruction.
 - iii. Other Academic Activities (e.g. labs, studio, hybrid, or online) one credit hour is assigned to three hours of student work per week throughout one semester of approximately 15 weeks in length or approximately 45hours of work.
