We are excited to share that Endicott College will expand the use of Workday to incorporate Student functionality in March 2025! Workday will provide easier and more convenient access to your student's grades, tuition balances, class schedules, and more—all in one place. Once Workday is live, your student will need to add you as a Friends & Family contact and grant third-party permissions for each module. In the coming months, we will provide more information to both students and parents on how to set up your accounts and navigate Workday.

Parking & Traffic

As part of the college's ongoing efforts to enhance the student experience, we are adjusting parking availability for sophomore resident students beginning in the 2025-26 academic year.

To create a more sustainable and accessible campus, parking for sophomore resident students will be limited and assigned through a random selection process. More details, including the application deadline, will be shared soon.

Students who are not selected through the initial process will have an opportunity to apply for a waiver. Waivers may be granted for medical needs, off-campus employment, internships, clinicals, or other extenuating circumstances. The Center for Accessibility Services will review medical waiver requests for students requiring frequent off-campus appointments, while the Parking & Traffic Office will handle all other waiver requests. Students applying for an employment waiver must work a minimum of 12 hours per week.

For those not selected, we encourage them to explore the various transportation options offered by the college.

Housing Accommodations for the 2025-2026 School Year:

- If your student is looking to apply for housing accommodations for the 2025-2026 school year, the deadline is March 3, 2025. To apply for housing accommodations, your student must sign into their Endicott Google account to open and complete our <u>Accessibility Services Accommodation Request Form</u>. Please include our <u>Disability Verification Form Housing</u> to be filled out by your provider with your application. Our housing committee will review the application and determine if the requested accommodation is necessary for disability-related access.
- If your student currently has housing accommodations and is looking to **renew their current accommodations** for the 2025-2026 school year, their deadline to renew their accommodation is March 14, 2025. They will be emailed a form to complete by the Center of Accessibility to share their housing accommodation intentions.
