

reduction; decrease operating costs through more efficient and sustainable operations; and makes sure our students are educated global citizens. A team of faculty, staff, and students have been developing the College's first Campus Sustainability Plan, goals for the College to reach for true sustainability! Some of our proudest accomplishments include: Sourcing 13% of the campus's energy needs from renewable energy (from nearly 1.5 MW of solar power located on campus) Diverting about 50% of campus waste from landfill via recycling and composting
